The theme for the year 2021 is: A Voice to Lead - A vision for future healthcare.








International Day of Families is observed every year on 15th May. Family is the basic unit of society. This day provides an opportunity to raise awareness about the issues related to the families and to increase knowledge about the social, economic and demographic processes that affect them. "Families and New Technologies" is the theme for International Family Day 2021.







World Telecommunication Day is observed every year on 17th May since 1969. It marks the founding of International Telecommunication Union(ITU) when the first International Telegraph Convention was signed in Paris on 17th May, 1865. It is also known as World Telecommunication and Information Society Day. The theme for World Telecommunication and Information Society Day (WTISD) 2021 is "Accelerating Digital Transformation in challenging times".



World Hypertension Day is celebrated by World Hypertension League (WHL) on 17th May since 2006. The day promotes the awareness about hypertension and to encourage people to prevent and control this silent killer epidemic. The theme for World Hypertension day 2021 is "Measure Your Blood Pressure Accurately, Control It, Live Longer".







International Museum Day is observed on 18th May every year to raise awareness about museums and their role in society. The International Council of Museums (ICOM) created International Museum Day in 1977. The Organisation suggested a proper theme every year which may include globalization, bridging cultural gaps and care for the environment. The theme for International Museum day 2021 is "The Future of Museums: Recover and Reimagine".



Worlds AIDS Vaccine Day or HIV Vaccine Awareness Day is observed every year on 18th May. This day marks the efforts of thousands of researchers, scientists, health professionals who have contributed to the process of finding safe and effective AIDS medicine. It is also an opportunity to educate communities about the importance of preventive HIV vaccine research.





Every year on the third Friday in May National Endangered Species Day is celebrated annually to raise awareness about the importance of wildlife conservation and restoration efforts for all imperiled species. Endangered Species Act 1973, focuses on the protection of wildlife and threatened species.

National Anti-Terrorism Day is observed every year on 21st May to spread awareness about the violence caused by the terrorists and also in the memory of former Indian PM Rajiv Gandhi who passed away on this day.









The United Nations has proclaimed 22nd May as the International Day for Biological Diversity (IDB) to raise global awareness about the importance of protecting biological resources and the global biodiversity that shapes our environment. The theme for International Day for Biological Diversity 2021 is "We're part of the solution".







Commonwealth Day is an annual celebration of the Commonwealth association and its members. Focusing on a different theme each year, it takes place on the second Monday in March. Its purpose is to promote understanding about global issues, international co-operation and the work of the Commonwealth. The modern theme for Commonwealth Day 2021 is 'Delivering a Common Future'. This year's theme highlights how the 54 member countries in the Commonwealth family are 'innovating, connecting and transforming' to help achieve some of its biggest goals, like protecting natural resources and boosting trade.







A lunar eclipse occurs when the moon moves into the Earth's shadow. This can occur only when the Sun, Earth, and Moon are exactly or very closely aligned with Earth between the other two, and only on the night of a full moon. A totally eclipsed Moon is sometimes called a blood moon due to its reddish color, which is caused by Earth completely blocking direct sunlight from reaching the Moon. The first lunar eclipse of 2021 will take place on May 26th.

Constitutional Values

Article 368 dictates the procedure for constitutional amendments. Amendments are additions, variations or repeal of any part of the constitution by Parliament. An amendment bill must be passed by each house of Parliament by a two-thirds majority of its total membership when at least two-thirds are present and vote. Certain amendments pertaining to the constitution's federal nature must also be ratified by a majority of state legislatures.

Constitutional Values

Abolition of titles:

- 1.No title, not being a military or academic distinction, shall be conferred by the State.
- 2. No citizen of India shall accept any title from any foreign State.
- 3. No person who is not a citizen of India shall, while he holds any office of profit or trust under the State, accept without the consent of the President any title from any foreign State.
- 4. No person holding any office of profit or trust under the State shall, without the consent of the President, accept any present, emolument, or office of any kind from or under any foreign State.

Environmental Fact of the Day

The smoke generated from burning tobacco, called secondhand smoke or environmental tobacco smoke, contains more than 7,000 toxic chemicals that pollute both indoor and outdoor environments and can be toxic even after the tobacco product is put out. The health impacts of environmental tobacco smoke exposure include lung cancer, cardiovascular disease and pulmonary disease.



Constitutional Values

The Indian constitution is considered federal in nature, and unitary in spirit. It has features of a federation, including a codified, supreme constitution; a three-tier governmental structure (central, state and local); division of powers; bicameralism; and an independent judiciary. It also possesses unitary features such as a single constitution, single citizenship, an integrated judiciary, a flexible constitution, a strong central government, appointment of state governors by the central government, All India Services (the IAS, IFS and IPS), and emergency provisions. This unique combination makes it quasi-federal in form.
